As of April 30, 2023, tithes, offerings, and other gifts totaled \$218,393 against a budget of \$249,702. Our expenses through April were well-managed at \$232,053 resulting in a net operating loss of \$13,660 for the month. Our YTD net operating total is \$25,783. Over the next few weeks, FBC Evans will continue to worship together, ministering to her people as they celebrate their legacy in ministry and grieve the closing of their campus. Stewardship

Churches, like other organizations, require funds to operate and are dependent on the tithes and offerings given by members. Tithing is the practice of giving one tenth of one's income to the church to support the general operation and mission of the church while offerings are gifts of any amount made to the church. Giving, regardless of the amount, helps to remind us that everything we have comes from God and is made available to us through his grace. When we consider all he has done for us - his deep, immeasurable, sacrificial gift to us - the question becomes: How do we respond to a gift like that? The answer is that we worship Him and do what pleases him and brings him glory. Giving has always been a form of worship in the Bible and we are commanded to honor and glorify God in this way. The Old Testament requires us to bring the firstborn of our flock and the first fruits of the harvest, while in the New Testament, Jesus praises the widow for giving all she had. When we give generously and sacrificially, God is glorified and others may come to know him.

At FBC Augusta, we are blessed to have a generous and faithful congregation who support our ministry financially. However, we recognize many of you may have travel plans that will keep you away from church over the summer months. - 6. If this is a recurring gift, choose the frequency, the date the gift should be charged to your account and the date that the recurring gift should end.
- 7. Click Next: Payment Details
- 8. Click the Sign In button and create your id and password.
- 9. Add a payment method.
